Details of Proposed Activities in Action Plan and Budget

- a) Teaching Facilities (U.G.)- Our college intends to achieve excellence in teaching. It has been making unceasing efforts to give widening access to maximum number of women in higher education. For achieving excellence in teaching adequate infrastructural facilities and dedicated academic community is essential. The college intends to adopt student centered, skill oriented and need based academic programmes to enhance their employability. Furthering the cause of social justice we want to organize special coaching for socially backward students. We want to organise national and international seminars, conferences and workshops and expert lectures on recent academic issues and modern teaching learning process. To bring the unexplored skills and talents among the students and impart we intend to provide on job training and field To transform the way we teach and communicate and provide the students update knowledge about the subject we want to upgrade our computer labs and Home -science lab. and enrich our library resources. Thus we need funds for both recurring and non-recurring expenditure on the above mentioned activities.
- b) Research To facilitate critical research among the faculty as well as the students our college intends to undertake publication activity. We want to organize seminars and conferences in order to inculcate research attitude among the teachers and students. To tackle the issues of local community the college desires to provide project work for the students and teachers. Field visits are to be undertaken for this research work. Home science department of our college is planning to provide consultancy services regarding dietetics, physical fitness, nutrition, fashion-designing, entrepreneurship, food processing in the coming future. Computer and internet facilities are needed to carry out research activities. All these activities need both recurring and non-recurring grants.

- c) Extension Activities The college along with the academic contribution intends to make significant contribution to community service and nation building. Our faculty and students desire to conduct save baby campaign, health check up programs, entrepreneurship development camp, environment protection programs etc. for the local rural community. We are in need of grants for organizing such extension activities.
- d) Any other In addition to the abovementioned activities, we want to conduct placement activities for our students. We intend to establish linkages with banks, patsansthas, insurance offices, computer centres, factories, educational institutions etc. for placement activities. The college will conduct programs on interview techniques, group discussion, leadership etc. to facilitate students' placement. For maintaining the database of students computer facilities are needed. Expert lectures will be organized to provide the students knowledge about various career opportunities.
